## Biography

*From Safe Mothers to Saving Babies Dr. Page’s impact is profound. As PI, she has garnered over \$12M in active grant funding. She is the founding Director of the ‘Program of Excellence for Mothers, Children and Families’ to address gaps and save lives in underserved areas across Texas, the nation, and the world.*

*Dr. Page is the sole Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) and Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM) appointed by the Health and Human Services Commissioner to the Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee, embodying the voice of CNMs serving diverse populations across the state. As the selected maternal health researcher on the Texas Research-to-Policy Collaborative, she advises legislators on health policy to advance the health of at-risk mothers across Texas.*

*She mentors dozens of cross-disciplinary undergraduate and graduate students culminating in 16 student-led publications in high-impact journals. Her Google Scholar profile h-index is 13 and she has earned the College’s “Best Faculty Publication” three times. Dr. Page earns high marks for teaching and created new courses for graduate nursing students, including Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) modules on maternal and women’s health and core courses such as Population Health. She serves as faculty preceptor for FNP students in women’s health and prenatal clinics across Texas serving Spanish-speaking and rural women.*

*Dr. Page’s awards include the highest honors in the profession – being selected as a Fellow in the American College of Nurse Midwives (FACNM) in 2021 and a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN) in 2023. Dr. Page is a reflective leader whose insight and poise advance collaborative innovation and impact. She is the immediate past Chair of the Council of Principal Investigators (CPI) at Texas A&M University, leading faculty PIs across the university who collectively expend more than \$1B in research endeavors. Dr. Page was the sole faculty recipient of the Community Engagement Award from the Office of the President at Texas A&M University. She has garnered accolades for her research in maternal health and community impact including the prestigious award for Research in Health Disparities by the Southern Nursing Research Society representing 14 states across the US.*
